### Message From the Board Chair David Purchase, 2022 Library Board Chair

This report aims to summarize the term of the present board from the beginning in 2019 to its end of office in 2022. In other words, where we have been, where we are and where we are going.

There is an apocryphal saying, "may you live in interesting times." The last four years have been, if nothing else, interesting. As a board we have faced serious existential crises with staffing, the state of the building, and public health. The focus and energy of this library board has, of necessity, been on just keeping the library going in some form. Other matters like advocacy, fund raising, planning and growth have been put aside. One hopes that the next four years will allow for time and energy to be spent on these and other matters.

While the library board has had to concentrate on just keeping things operational over the past four years, both the community itself and library use have been evolving. The population has grown by over 6% but is still older than the Ontario average with fewer people under 14 years and more over 65 years. Seasonal residences comprise over 20% of the dwellings in the municipality. There is a significant gap in income between low incomes and high incomes with over 5% of the population officially below the poverty line. While the population remains heavily anglophone in language and origin there are growing pockets of different cultures in the community, noticeably of Asian origin. As well there are over 500 persons identifying as indigenous.

### Message From the Board Chair David Purchase, 2022 Library Board Chair

The survey carried out in 2022 revealed marked differences in how sections of the community used the library. Children and seniors are the two age groups that most use the library with the age group from 18 to 34 years as the least likely to use the library. Most of the library uses come from the town core with limited usage from the municipality outskirts. While a large majority of the respondents were happy with the programs and service provided by the library there were a noticeable number of requests for the library to be open more days and hours. Hours of operation are basically a budget issue. The most frequent suggestion for expansion was for an outdoor space as part of the library premises. Almost every responder was happy with the service provided by the library staff.

Where then should we go? The immediate goals of the new library board should focus on the orientation of new members and the construction of a new four-year strategic plan. What directions should this strategic plan take? One is to focus more time and energy on advocacy and long-term planning including changing the physical space of the library. However, the old standards no longer apply as technology and community use of libraries evolve.

This report marks the end of my lifespan as a board trustee. We now appear to have capable and stable staff under solid and knowledgeable leadership along with a clarified relationship with the Town under the expanded memorandum of understanding. The current board is in capable hands, and it has been a pleasure working with everyone over my 12 years and I hope that everyone, staff, and trustees alike, have a positive and productive new term.




